

Anchor Bracelet



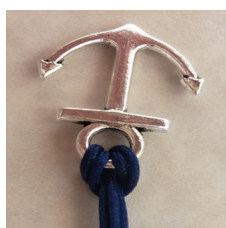
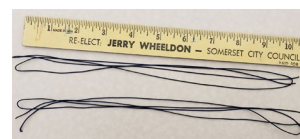
Supplies

Included : Macramé cord, Anchor charm, Wooden beads

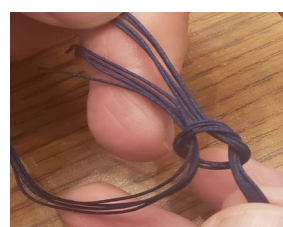
Not Included: Scissors, Ruler

1. Cut 8 pieces of cord approximately 10" long. Make two groups of 4 lengths of cord.

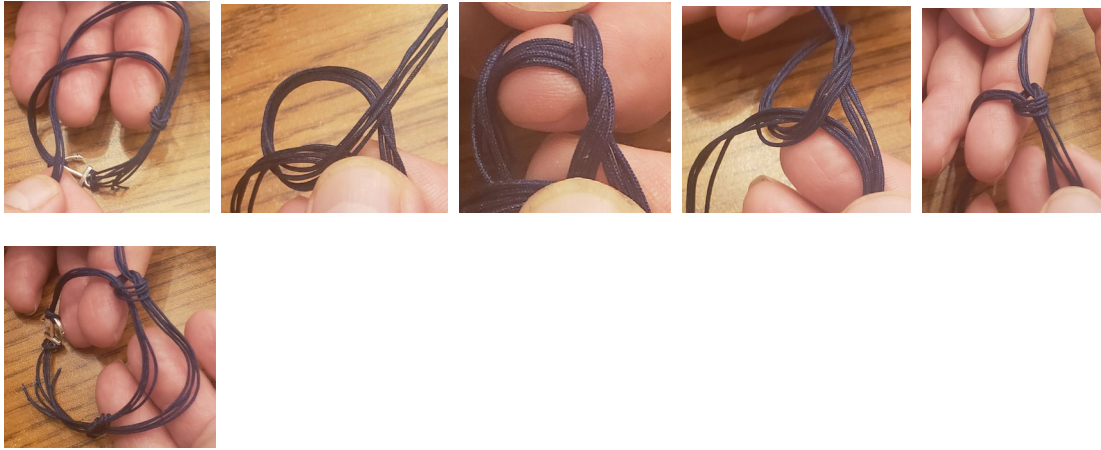
2. Take one of the groups, fold in half, put the folded end through the hole of the charm and make a half hitch. Do the same to the other end of the charm, however you will be putting it around the anchor portion of the charm.



3. You will now make a "slip knot" to secure the bracelet and make it easy to put on and take off. Follow pictures:



4. If you like, you can make a second slip knot on the other side of the knot you just made, this helps the bracelet lay flat (not necessary, however). Follow pictures:



5. Adjust the bracelet diameter to fit over your hand. Thread a bead on each side (you might need to ream out the whole in the bead to make it easier to thread the strings through). Tie a knot to secure the bead, cut off any remaining cord beyond the bead to your desired length.



Note: if you struggle with the diagrams above when tying the slip knot and have a computer you can go to “YouTube” and search “how to tie a simple slip knot”. There are several videos that will walk you through the above steps.
