

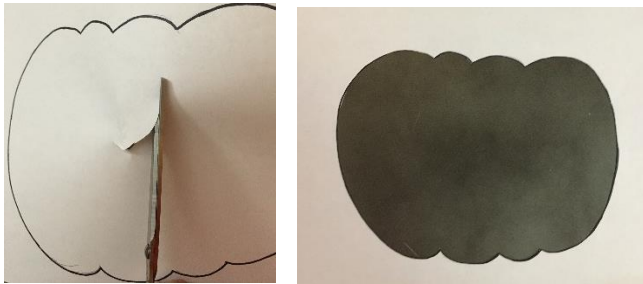
Paper strip pumpkin instructions

Supplies

Included: Cardstock (2), scrapbook paper, green tulle

Not Included: glue, scissors, cardboard or paper bag

1. Cut out the INSIDE of the pumpkin. This inside portion can be destroyed, but try and keep the outside as neat and wrinkle-free as possible.



2. Cut or tear the pieces of decorative scrapbook paper into strips. Keep them 7 inches long, but make them as thick or thin as you'd like. I made mine about 1 inch wide by 7 inches long.
3. Layout your strips of paper on the plain piece of cardstock (don't glue them down yet).
4. Place the piece of cardstock with the pumpkin outline over the other piece of paper with the strips on it. Make sure the decorative paper is showing through the whole pumpkin outline. Readjust your strips if necessary.



5. Glue down the strips of decorative paper.
6. Glue down the pumpkin outline. If using a glue stick, you can do steps 5 and 6 right after each other. If using a runny, watery glue, let everything dry after step 5 before going on to step 6.
7. Cut a rectangle out of a piece of cardboard (an old cereal or Kleenex box works great) or old paper bag for the pumpkin stem and glue it down.
8. Tie the piece of green tulle into a bow. Trim the ends, so it's as big or small as you want. Glue it at the base of the stem.
9. Ta-da!
